

St. Joseph's implements multi-year construction project

✦ PATERSON – St. Joseph's Healthcare System (SJHS) has implemented a \$250 million expansion and renovation investment project at both St. Joseph's Regional Medical Center/St. Joseph's Children's Hospital in Paterson and St. Joseph's Wayne Hospital in Wayne. The multi-year construction project will have a significant impact on the region. Designed to meet the growing demand for inpatient and outpatient care, it will expand the healthcare services offered to area residents, said William A. McDonald, president/CEO, SJHS. Shown is a rendering of one component

of the facilities project, the new 173,798-square-foot Critical Care Building at St. Joseph's Regional Medical Center in Paterson – slated for completion in 2012. This building will feature an Emergency Department with separate dedicated pediatric and adult facilities; a surgical suite with 12 systems integrated operating rooms, pre-operative and post-operative areas and a dedicated surgical waiting area; four Critical Care Units: Cardiac Care Unit/Open Heart Cardiac Care Unit, Surgical Intensive Care Unit, Medical Intensive Care Unit and an Intensive Respiratory Care Unit; and a rooftop helistop.
